The Women of the Newport Art Museum

The Museum has been nurtured, inspired, and enhanced by numerous women since its founding in 1912. This tour focuses on the remarkable contributions made by the women who helped create the museum we experience today. Maud Howe Elliot (daughter of Julia Ward Howe who wrote *The Battle Hymn of the Republic*) and Gertrude Vanderbilt Whitney, the most well known of the group, were international figures deeply involved with Newport and American art. Hear the stories of these artists, patrons, and muses as reflected in pieces from the permanent collection.



La Forge Restaurant

186 Bellevue Avenue

The restaurant is situated on the grounds of the International Tennis Hall of Fame and has been operated by the Crowley family for over 35 years.



Rough Point

680 Bellevue Avenue

Oceanfront estate of Doris Duke, heiress, philanthropist and art collector (1912-1993). The 2014 exhibit is *No Rules: The Personal Style of Doris Duke* and examines a portion of Doris



Duke's clothing collection ranging from lavish evening gowns with exquisite embroidery to the simple silhouette of a little black dress. Rough Point was built in 1891 by Frederick Vanderbilt and purchased by James B. Duke in 1922. After her father's death, Doris hired Horace Trumbauer to redesign the house, elegantly altering its original "Gothic" design.
